Minutes, Inaugural Meeting of the Kampoosa Bog Stewardship Committee Monday, September 19, 2022, 5 p.m.

1. History and status review

Discussion:

This was the first meeting of the committee, which is being brought back some 10 years or so after the previous committee was disbanded. Member Arthur Dutil is the only member from the previous committee to be a member of the new committee. The previous committee included members of many organizations, not just residents of Stockbridge.

2. Objectives and tasks

Stakeholder identification and outreach

Discussion:

Identification of stakeholders began with list of stakeholders identified in the Resource Management Plan of 1999:

The list of possible stakeholders was further expanded to include:

• citizens of Stockbridge and Lee,

- interested or affected landowners (landowners within the ACEC, abutters, landowners downstream of the ACEC): by way of shorthand, this group was identified as "expanded list of abutters"
 - The New England Wildflower Society
 - Berkshire Natural Resources Council
 - The Trustees of Reservations
 - The Stockbridge-Munsee community.

The idea was put forward to send a letter to previous members of the Kampoosa Stewardship Committee, reintroducing the project. A different letter might also be sent to the expanded list of abutters. The question arose how to limit the expanded list of abutters. Interest was expressed in communicating with organizations previously allied with the committee that might have documents of interest. Alert representatives of those organizations that the committee is being revived and asking about their interest in being involved. Stakeholder identification and outreach will likely become a standing item on the committee's agenda.

Hydrological study

Discussion:

Patrick White identified a current bid that opened on 5/7/22 for a Kampoosa Bog water quality and vegetative composition review and analysis study by NHESP. Multiple recent studies or parts of studies have been funded. This is an item that the committee will keep an eye on and return to in the future.

Records collection and review

Discussion:

The committee does not have a comprehensive record of either the previous committee's work, including minutes of meetings, or the history of work done in the ACEC. Sources of documents of interest to the committee may include the Stockbridge Library and Museum or Historical Commission archives, the Stockbridge and Lee Conservation Commissions, filing cabinets in Town Hall (Land Trust records, for example), the Massachusetts Historical Commission (re: archaeology, remains of buildings or mills) and records kept by various entities formerly part of the previous committee or organizations that continue to work and study in the ACEC. As the committee communicates with more people about the work of the committee, the committee will learn about other records. The question arose about where to put records that the committee collects. The committee has been allocated a digital folder, per Michael Canales, Town Administrator, location to be made known in the future. Interest expressed in requesting data-sharing agreements to gain access to electronic records at NHESP.

Endangered species catalog

Discussion: This item was discussed along the way in conversation about records collection and review.

Communications and community outreach

Discussion:

This item was discussed along the way in conversation about additional interested parties and stakeholders and in discussion of a letter to be sent to the expanded list of abutters and another letter to a list of possible stakeholders. Discussion went on to include a possible site visit and what would be needed by the committee members for such a visit.

3. Selection of leadership

Chair, Vice Chair, Secretary

Discussion:

Identification of responsibilities of chair, vice chair, and secretary. The chair runs the meetings, makes sure the agenda gets put together, holds people accountable. The chair will recap action items at the end of each meeting. The secretary takes minutes and posts them to the Town, records votes, who makes motions. The committee can also direct people to the Zoom meeting recording.

Regarding vice chair, the committee decided to add this position later if circumstances make it necessary, such as at a time when the membership of the committee expands.

Lisa Bozzuto made a motion to nominate Laura Beasley as Chair; Arthur Dutil seconded. VOTE: Unanimous. Laura Beasley made a motion that Louise Gachet be secretary; Lisa Bozzuto seconded. VOTE: Unanimous.

Working group assignments

Discussion:

From the 1999 Resource Management Plan, it is evident that there were lots of working sub-committees, but it feels early in the development of this new committee to be making working group assignments. Keep this as an agenda item for future meetings.

4. Meeting cadence

Discussion:

Meet monthly for now, on third Monday of each month at 5 p.m. in Stockbridge Town Hall. Once working group assignments are under way, the committee could meet twice a month.
