

STOCKBRIDGE SELECT BOARD MEETING MINUTES
Thursday, June 17, 2021

Call to Order:

Roxanne called the meeting to order.

Regarding the Annual Entertainment License application of Hand-Crafted catering for events located at 2 Depot Street owned by the Berkshire Scenic Railway Museum Inc. The Board will continue this until June 24th at 6:30 p.m. as requested information was sent at 9:39 p.m. last night and the Board has not had a chance to review it.

Next was the National Grid Pole Hearing. Roxane made a motion to open the National Grid pole hearing. Patrick seconded; Aye Patrick, Aye Roxanne, Aye Chuck. Steve Hayward stated that they were requesting to install 4 new poles to Rattlesnake Mountain Road to provide service to a new residence. Sally Underwood-Miller, the resident stated that she was shocked that it was \$7,000 per pole. Hearing no other comments, Roxanne moved to close the National Grid pole hearing. Chuck seconded; Aye Chuck, Aye Roxanne, Aye Patrick. Chuck made a motion to approve the poles. Roxanne seconded; Aye Patrick, Aye Roxanne, Aye Chuck.

Next was to take action on meeting minutes from June 1 and June 3, 2021. Chuck made a motion that they accept the minutes. Patrick seconded; all were in favor.

Regarding project updates, Roxanne said that Kate Fletcher will give and update on the Cat & Dog Fountain at the June 24th, 6:30 p.m. meeting.

Mike Buffoni gave Water Department updates. He said that the Curtisville Bridge utility bridge project is being wrapped up. They are cleaning up the site and adding fencing and signage to secure the area. The Curtisville Bridge is closed to all forms of traffic and the Utility bridge is not for pedestrians. Hugh stated that they will be putting up 'keep off' signs.

Tony gave an update on the pump station. As the funding was approved at Town Meeting, they will be moving forward. If started by the end of this month, the consulting engineer felt that he would be out to bid by the end of October – early November, with spring construction.

Hugh next gave Highway updates. Hugh said that they have had a couple concerns on Mahkeenac Heights area with road growth and they will be addressing it. On Vine Street there is a new stop and yield sign. The pothole on the corner of Rt. 183 and Larrywaug Cross Road has been filled as well as the pothole on the sidewalk in front of the Post Office. New signs are also ordered to direct traffic on North Church Street and Larrywaug Cross Road. Mike added that the new Police speed monitors will be strategically placed around Town. Hugh brought in an example of the new trash cans ordered for Main Street. The Board agreed to use them for trash and bottle and can recycling.

Mike updated that the Curtisville Utility Bridge project is almost complete. The Larrywaug Bridge construction is moving ahead with the North and South footings installed. MassDOT will be in to identify the upcoming road projects to include paving of Interlaken as well as the three identified last year; with the anticipation of an October resurfacing. The first Averic Road Bridge repair will start in August with an anticipated completion of October. The garage roof is anticipated to be completed this week.
